

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IIM 2018 Identity Award

This year's Identity Award was bestowed *ex aequo* to two personalities residing in the United States of America for their contribution to strengthening the sense of belonging to Macau. The governing bodies of the International Institute of Macau (IIM) decided to grant this Award to Frederico Alberto Silva, better known by Jim, and António Manuel Pacheco Jorge da Silva. They have dedicated the best of their years to serving the Macanese Community in the Diaspora, both of whom as President respectively in UMA, Inc. and the Lusitano Club of California.



Jim Silva was a professional in the financial area in Hong Kong, having written texts that were published into books on his memoirs of the Pacific War, and his knowledge of the patuá, religion, cuisine and cultural legacy of his grandparents, elements which can be aggregators of a community. Jim Silva published six booklets, including "All our Yesterdays" and

"Reminiscences of a wartime refugee in Macau".

António Jorge da Silva, who worked as an architect in Macau, Hong Kong, the UK and the USA, retired early to devote himself to writing the history of Portuguese descendants in Macau, including his experiences in many regions of China and integration into the countries of the diaspora, and analyzing their social and cultural implications. Among his works are



"The Portuguese Community in Hong Kong (2 vol.)", "... Shanghai", and a third one about Macau in the forge; "Macaense Cuisine - Origins and Evolution"; "Macaenses - the Portuguese in China", which is being translated also into the Chinese language.

Unselfishly and persistently, they have both devoted part of their lives to publicize the history and culture of Macau and enhanced the appreciation and strengthening of the Macau Identity.

The Award, instituted since 2003, is given by a collective decision of IIM's social bodies and aims to award individuals or institutions that have continuously contributed to the strengthening and enhancement of Macanese identity. Among those awardees in the past, include such figures as Monsignor Manuel Teixeira, Henrique de Senna Fernandes, Arnaldo de Oliveira Sales, and institutions such as the Diocese of Macau, Holy House of Mercy (Santa Casa da Misericórdia), the University of Macau, the Portuguese School of Macau (EPM) and other bodies, both local and abroad, linked to the Macanese diaspora.

The Macaenses and their Interaction with the Luso-American Community in California

June 23, 2018 Presentation by José Luís da Silva at Macau Cultural Center



For many years there may have been the perception, or even the reality, of the Macanese-American community existing in parallel with the Luso-American community in this State. If that was the reality or the perception, I believe that the gap is gradually closing and we can say today that the two communities, if not united completely as one, are at least moving in perfect unison.

First of all, let's make one thing perfectly clear. As I tell my friends many times, Macaenses are as Portuguese as any other, sometimes even more so by their unrelenting love of our common motherland, language and culture. One culture does not subtract from another, it enriches it. The fact that Macaenses share the Portuguese and Chinese cultures in their hearts and minds, only serves to highlight their perception of the grandeur of both cultures.

I cannot think of another group of Portuguese who deserves more the words of our great poet Luis de Camões who, in Macau, wrote in Os *Lusíadas*, the last great classical epic poem, the following:

"Ditosa a pátria que tais filhos tem"

"Fortunate is the motherland that has such offspring"

Macaenses have been for almost 500 years the most loyal Portuguese, earning for Macau the official title of "Não há outra mais leal" / "There is none more loyal."

In the last few years many steps have been taken on both sides to unite the Macanese community with other Portuguese in California. I will address today some of this progress in the hope of motivating others to do even more.

About five years ago, recognizing the need to maintain and promote the Portuguese language and culture among Macaenses in California, the presidents of the three organizations associated with the Macau Cultural Center - Clube Lusitano, UMA and Casa de Macau - invited me as support teacher for Portuguese Programs in California under the auspices of Instituto Camões, from Portugal, to discuss the possibility of having Portuguese language and culture classes in this center. The meeting went so well, the support of Macaenses of all spectrum was so strong that a decision was made to start such a program. Since then, professor Aurélio Dias Ferreira, at times, and I have carried out Portuguese language and culture classes in this hall. Through the effort of the leadership of the Macau Cultural Center, in the person of its director, Maria Roliz, the Fundação Luso-Americana para a Desenvolvimento, in Portugal, has twice awarded grants to help support the classes. Next month, a new series of classes will start and anyone can enroll.

The Macaense community has forged deep connections with several Portuguese-American institutions in California. The Luso-American Education Foundation, of which I was President and Chairman of the Board in the past, has been such an organization. For many years, Arthur Britto has been a committed member of the Advisory Board of the Foundation. For the last three LAEF summer camps, which take place annually at different university campuses, the Lusitano Club has sponsored kids to attend and their participation has been very enriching to all. Coincidentally, this year's top scholarship recipient from the LAEF was a Macaense young lady who attended the summer camp two years in a row.

Another point of connection between the two communities is the Freitas Library, at PFSA headquarters in San Leandro. There, an excellent collection of materials on Macau has been assembled and it is available to all who want to consult it.

The relationship between the Macaenses and the Portuguese Heritage Society of California has been especially strong as evidenced by its involvement in the Dia de Portugal celebrations in Kelly Park. Four members of the Macaense community - Maria Roliz, Arthur Britto, Nuno Prata da Cruz and Eduardo Collaço - were members of the organizing committee for that event. Clube Lusitano continued a long tradition by having a food booth with Cozinha Macaense. This year, the Portuguese Museum presented a wonderful special display inaugurated during Dia de Portugal, entitled "Five Hundred Years of Macau", which has been viewed by large numbers of visitors.

One activity that has helped maintain and solidify the connection between the two communities has been the annual trips to Portugal organized by Clube Lusitano, which included a trip to the Azores, home to most Portuguese communities in California, where they were received in the Regional Presidential Palace and had a reception with regional gastronomy at a hotel in Ponta Delgada which was formerly my elementary school. Perhaps most indicative of the close ties between the Macaenses and other Portuguese in California is the fact that during the last Encontro, which took place in Macau, more than twenty non-Macaense Portuguese flew to Macau to participate and celebrate the Macaense experience together with their brothers and sisters from Macau living in the diaspora. Next year, with the outstanding promotion of the event that the Macaense organizations have been doing, a much larger number of Portuguese-Americans is expected at the Encontro.

In recognition of the increasing importance of the Macaense community in Portuguese events in California last year, the Consul-General of Portugal in San Francisco, Dr. Maria João Lopes Cardoso, appointed Maria Roliz to the Conselho Consultivo (Advisory Board) of the Consulate. This year, Maria was selected by the Consul-General for the committee organizing the reception for the Portuguese Prime-Minister, Dr. António Costa, which took place in Santa Clara on June 11.

Many activities and ongoing events have brought the two groups together. Those of us who attend the weekly Wednesday dinners at Casa do Benfica in San Jose know very well that there is a steady presence of the Macaense community there bringing friendship, good disposition and warmth to the event.

The Macaense presence in more formal events has also been very important. During the visit of the Portuguese Secretary of State for Communities, Dr. José Luis Carneiro, at the Portuguese Athletic Club in San Jose, a large number of Macaenses attended the reception and engaged in conversation with the official visitor. On May 4th of this year during the celebration of the Dia da Língua Portuguesa at the Portuguese Consulate General in San Francisco, a large group of Macaenses, together with other Portuguese and Brazilians, enjoyed the beauty of the Portuguese language through literary pieces and songs. It was a wonderful display of unity by people from three continents, who were there united by the richness of the language of Camões.

We are now at a crossroads in our Portuguese community in California. What we do now will influence generations to come. The preservation and expansion of our Portuguese language and cultures yes "cultures" because the Portuguese language connects many cultures throughout the globe - is of the utmost importance. With that in mind, a Strategic Plan for the Teaching of the Portuguese Language and Cultures in California has just been elaborated and presented. This plan, sponsored by the Luso-American Education Foundation and the Fundação Luso-Americana para o Desenvolvimento is the result of a meticulous process headed by my good friends Dr. Duarte Silva from Stanford and Professor Diniz Borges, with the support of yours truly and many others. After several meetings throughout the State with the input from all kinds of individuals in our community associated with Portugal, Macau and Brazil, the strategic plan was finally revealed this month in Sacramento during the CPAC Conference. Its title is "Portuguese Beyond Borders - Inspiring Language, Culture, Heart & Community: A Visionary Strategic Plan for Advancing the Learning of Portuguese Language and Culture in California". In it lies a step-by-step process to include all elements of our communities in the glorious task of bringing the Portuguese language and cultures not only to people who share our common heritage, but to all Californians who would benefit from the knowledge of the 6th most spoken language in the globe, the 3rd European language with most speakers, and the most spoken language in the southern hemisphere. I urge the Macaense community to get behind the project not only to preserve your linguistic and cultural inheritance, but to help provide Portuguese language and culture to all Californians who will benefit from knowing a global language with a great future. As stated in the preface of the Strategic Plan,

"Portuguese is the 6th most spoken language in the world, present on five continents, and the most used language in the Southern Hemisphere, where it is the language of over 250 million people. It is the official language of eight countries (Angola, Brasil, Cabo Verde, Guiné-Bissau, Moçambique, Portugal, São Tomé e Príncipe, Timor-Leste, as well as the gateway territory of Macau in China). As a global language, Portuguese is also present in the Portuguese speaking diaspora in North America (Canada and the United States) where it is spoken by about two million inhabitants as well as in many European countries where immigrants from the Portuguese speaking world, and their descendants, have made their home."

As you can see, the paths of the Macaense people and other Portuguese speakers in this State are gradually less and less parallel as we share common trails. United by a history that resulted from the encounter of the Portuguese with peoples from all parts of the globe, we can now work together to unify those who share our common linguistic inheritance, enriched by many cultures. If those in this State who trace their roots to mainland Portugal, Azores, Madeira, Macau, Goa, Brazil and lusophone lands in Africa work together, we can make California an example of what can be accomplished to value and enrich our common heritage. The Macaense community has been in the forefront of this unifying endeavor and for this it deserves our greatest appreciation and recognition.

Hong Kong Portuguese Community Artefact Collection Campaign

Dear Friends of the Portuguese communities around the world,

I am very pleased to inform you that the Hong Kong Museum of History is proceeding with the Research Project and the Artefact Collection Campaign for the construction of an exhibition of the history of the Portuguese community of Hong Kong.

Summary about the project:

- 1. The Hong Kong Museum of History is revamping its main gallery. A four-year project.
- 2. In revamping, the histories of the ethnic communities will also be shown.
- 3. We, the Portuguese community, being the largest at one time, have been invited to proceed first.
- 4. I have been appointed the Principal Project Coordinator, working with the Hong Kong Museum of History and a team of researchers in Hong Kong, Macau and Portugal. Amongst others, Stuart Braga and Antonio (Toneco) Jorge da Silva are on the Honorary Board of Advisers.
- 5. So, Stuart and Toneco are being involved at one level and the members of the casas around the world are being involved at another level. Thus, the whole community is involved.
- 6. I have designed the themes for the exhibition and am responsible to submit the research reports on the history backing the themes.
- 7. I am also responsible to liaise with the members of our community about the gathering of artefacts for display.
- 8. I am working with the Consul General in Macau and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Lisbon as well as a number of institutions in Hong Kong, Macau and Portugal.
- 9. The themes are basically of three groupings:
- The legacies of the Portuguese. We, the descendants; Catholicism, ethnic food and Patuá that makes up our heritage and culture; and, Portuguese words and expressions in the lingua franca of the region. I am using the opportunity to pay tribute to our woman folk "The Cultural Heroines".

- Historical events, we have a very colouful history, we contributed much to Hong Kong to the point of a number of our boys paying the ultimate price defending Hong Kong during the Japanese invasion and the subsequent occupation. We were involved in just about all aspects of Hong Kong. Over the years, we have had outstanding personalities working for the good of Hong Kong. There is much to tell.
- There is a break before moving to the last theme, the departure of the British and the beginning of a new chapter under the HKSAR administration.
- I close with the "Ongoing Story" telling what currently we, the community, are doing in Hong Kong and overseas to preserve and to pass on our heritage and culture.
- 10. It is opportune of the Museum to exhibit our history to revive collective memory and for those who do not know, to introduce us. It is sad but not that many people know us nowadays. We are more recognised individually and not as a group.
- 11. This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity and I am most keen that our stories be told properly and in memorable ways. I am very excited. We must also bear in mind that our history is also the history of Hong Kong. Hong Kong gave us the opportunities.
- 12. Talking to people, people get keen and would like to get involved. I have been receiving tremendous support.
- 13. I will be doing interviews for the oral histories.

Cheese Toast ... by Dorothy Oliveira



Ingredients:

7oz pkg Mexican mix cheese 4oz butter 1 egg 1/2 cup sugar 1/2 cup Kraft cheese 1 tsp Coleman's mustard 10 slices of bread (20 triangles)

Instructions:

Beat egg and mix in room temperature butter. Add sugar, mustard and cheese. Use white bread and cut crust off. Cut into triangles. Put under broiler and brown a bit on one side. Spread cheese mixture on other side and brown. Watch carefully as the cheese mixture can burn very quickly.

Flan ... by Robert Leitao

Ingredients:

12 eggs 6 cups whole milk 1 cup sugar to brown in the pan 1 cup sugar for the flan 3 tablespoons vanilla Pinch of salt Add orange or lemon zest if one desires a different flavor

Instructions:

Brown one cup of sugar in pan and let cool. Mix all remaining ingredients. Warm liquid to shorten time in oven. Pour into pan and cook in water bath at 350 degrees. Check with cake tester or bamboo skewer 45 minutes to an hour and a half depending upon temperature of liquid. Overcooking will create bubbles and undesirable texture.
