

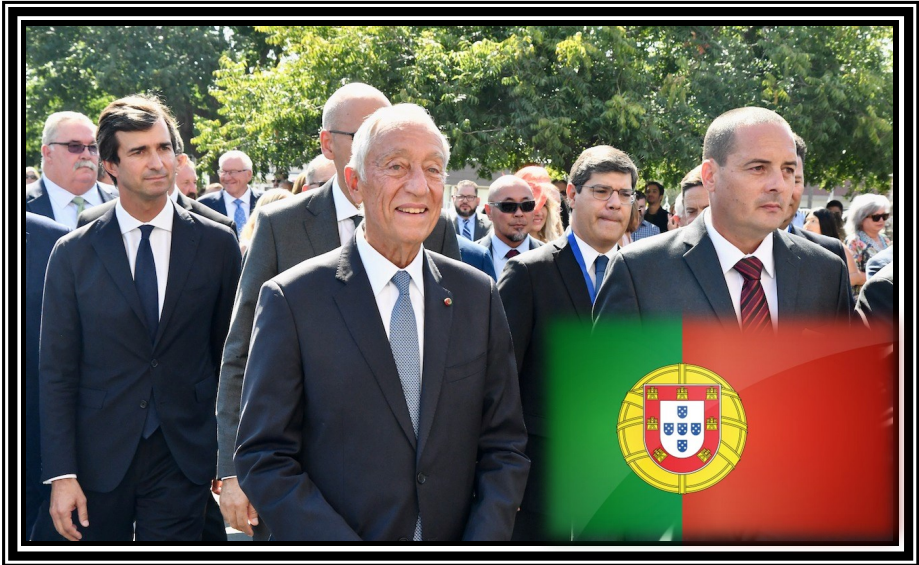

# Lusitano Trip to Eastern Europe

Old Castles, meandering river cruises, a once every ten years magnificent play; a thirteen day adventure awaited our group to Budapest, Vienna, Prague, Oberammergau, and Munich from June 16-28. Eighteen of us travelled from Nor Cal, So Cal, Brazil and Florida to converge on Budapest, the 1st stop on our trip.

I was fortunate to arrive a day early, and visited the largest European thermal bath, at Szechenyi Spa & Baths. The wonderfully bright yellow colors of the Palace and the modern Renaissance style are a true eye-catcher and expansive, very easily occupying at least 2 city blocks. We enjoyed exploring and soaking in the 18 pools, with temperatures ranging from 100 °F

to the 50 °F pool. Maria Roliz tried to lure Hunter into the very cold pool by blocking the temperature sign and pretending to stand in warm water, but he was not fooled by her trickery.

Our trip officially started with a private dinner at the hotel, where everyone met and got to know each other. We spent three days in Budapest. Our tour guide filled us with facts and history. We toured Buda and Pest; two cities in one! Buda on a hill, historical part of the city and Pest on a plain, its shops and boulevards both separated by the Danube flowing between them and connected by magnificent bridges. We marveled at the beauty of the buildings and were captivated by the history. It was also sobering to see remnants of the wars, such as







“Shoes on the Danube”, sixty pairs of period-appropriate shoes out of iron adjacent to the riverbank representing the shoes left behind by Jewish people who were shot and thrown in the river by the Hungarian military in the 1940s..

Our next stop was Vienna,

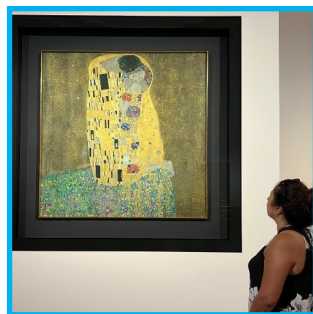
where we spent three days. A few of the places we visited were the City center, Schronbrunn Castle (a wedding gift to Maria Theresa) and Melk Benedictine Abbey from the 11th century where at least 100,000 books are. Venturing outside the tour, we attended a classical concert performed by a



string quartet at the Baroque St Peter's Church. We sat in the hard wooden pews and enjoyed Mozart, Schubert to Vivaldi, a wonderful ending to the day. The next day, some of us explored the Belvedere Museum, where we were able to see many of Gustav Klimt's works including the “Kiss”, (depicting

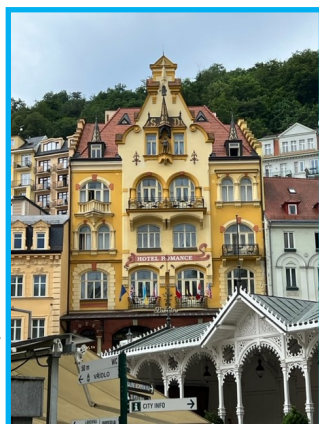


an embracing couple kneeling in a grassy patch of wildflowers), which is even more beautiful when seen in person. Having Uber was extremely useful in getting around outside the tour. Virginia Tsai, Patrick and Etta Siu purchased the world famous Sacher Torte cake and generously shared it with us. It was delicious and decadent and went very well with coffee. One item checked off the bucket list.



After a 5 hr bus ride, we arrived in Prague. Fortunately for the group, we had Tai Chi master Eugene Jew and Yoga master Virginia Tsai show us a few routines to stretch our sore backs and muscles that were tight from sitting so long. We visited Prague castle (founded in the 9th century),

and explored several towns with old bridges and alleyways. Our third and last river cruise was on the Vltava River and was particularly unique not for the abundant picturesque views, nor the delicious food and wine but for an engineering feature, river locks. The dinner cruise entered a gated area, the area filled with water, raising the water level, then the 2nd gate opened to the raised portion of the river and continued on its merry way. A







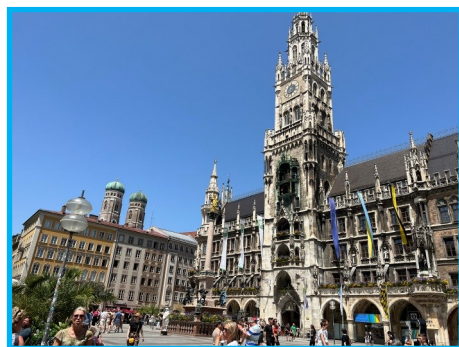
mini version of the Panama/Suez canal. Another item checked off the bucket list.

Oberammergau was the next stop on the tour, and as reported from Maria Roliz, it was quite a contrast to the cities we had just visited. Its rolling green hills, fresh crisp air and chalets reminded her of scenes from the Sound of Music where Maria and the Von Trapp children frolicked in the nearby countryside. After a relaxing day leisurely exploring the town and laying out on the loungers and soaking in the sun, the day culminated into the highlight of the trip, the Passion Play. It was a lengthy, opulent and spectacular production by the local townsfolk with more than half of the village on stage. It was interesting to know only those who have been born and raised in Oberammergau or have lived in the village for at least 20 years can become part of the Passion Play cast, children exempted. It

was captivating, wonderful, sad and moving all at once.

Our final stop was Munich, home to centuries-old buildings, historic sites, numerous museums, beautiful parks and castles where we spent the next two days.

The trip was excellently planned with a perfect blend of planned tour and free time, walking/exploring mixed with relaxing meandering lunch/dinner camaraderie and everyone had a



super great time. Many thanks to Bonnie Braga and Maria Roliz for arranging the trip. Looking forward to the next Lusitano trip.

He graciously accepted it with a smile and said "ah yes, Macau".

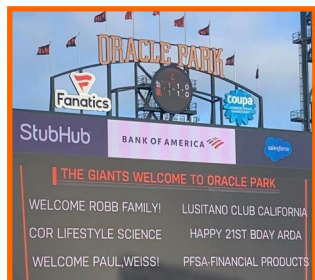

# TIBURON PORTUGUESE MURAL GROUND BREAKING CEREMONY

What a fun and memorable morning in Tiburon for the dedication of the azulejo mural commemorating Marin's Portuguese dairy heritage on the site adjacent to the old Little Reed Dairy which now stands the Del Mar Middle School on September 28th.

It was an absolutely gorgeous and perfect day to take advantage and welcome the President of the Republic of Portugal Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa for a ground breaking ceremony during his California tour. Everyone cheered as the President arrived walking down the trail with his delegation of dignitaries and significant contributors of this mural project.



His Excellency once again made a wonderful impression and gave an excellent speech and expressed how much he enjoyed his visit to California. He grasped hands, kissed cheeks, posed for photos as he did throughout his tour of California. He took innumerable selfies with those in attendance including myself. It was indeed an honor to be in the presence of a people's President and we are all so thankful of his visit. We wish him a safe trip back home. Boa Viagem!

The basis of this new mural comprised of azulejo tiles to be imported from Portugal is designed by California-Azorean artist João De Brito who was inspired by the area surrounding the old Little Reed Dairy and his impression of it. The tiles will arrive in November and Joe and Eddie Faria will be installing them. This is a wonderful addition to the public art around Marin that highlights our Portuguese heritage. Dairies in the late 1800s and early 1900s were operated by Portuguese-Azorean immigrant families and were a key facet of the overall economy in Marin.

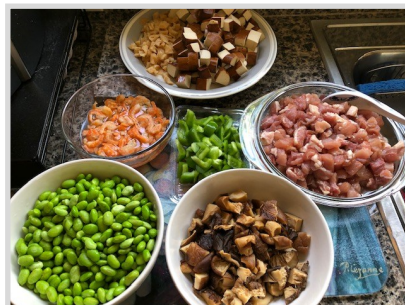


## RECIPE by Maria Roliz

***Chau Chau Chili*** - A Macanese family recipe that my dad Rigo used to make often at the many big house parties we had. The portions in this recipe has been adjusted for smaller meal portions.

### ***Ingredients:***

- 2 lbs boneless pork
- ½ pkg preserved turnip
- 1 pkg dried shrimp medium size
- 12-16 dried black mushrooms
- 1 pkg brown bean curd ½" thick
- ½ pkg frozen green soy bean
- 1 green bell pepper
- 1 bottle 8oz sweet bean sauce
- 1/3 bottle 13oz chili bean sauce (Toban Djan)
- ½ tsp salt
- ½ tsp pepper
- 3-4 Tbsp soya sauce
- 1 Tbsp sesame sauce



### ***Cooking Method:***

- Soak the mushrooms and shrimp for few hours until soft.
- Cut everything (pork, turnip, mushrooms, bell pepper, bean curd) to 1/2" cubes.
- Marinate pork in salt, pepper, soya, sesame sauce.
- In a big pot, fry the dried shrimp then the pork until brown.
- Add sweet bean sauce and half the amount of chili bean sauce and continue to fry in pot adding the mushrooms and turnip, coating all with the sauce while cooking.
- Add water to cover all ingredients.
- Bring to a boil, then add bean curd and soy beans.
- Cook over medium fire for 10 min.
- Add bell pepper.
- Cook another 10-15 min until water evaporates a little.
- Add sugar and adjust to add more chili bean sauce as needed.

***Best to eat with steamed rice. Serves 6.***

# ***2022 Lusitano Scholarship Recipient “Connor Casey”***

***Congratulations to Connor Casey, recipient of our 2022-2023 Lusitano Scholarship Grant, and Thank you for sharing your story!***



Attending the 2019 Luso-American Education Foundation Cultural Youth Summer Camp at UC Santa Cruz was one of my fondest childhood memories. I loved learning about my Portuguese heritage alongside fellow Portuguese students, many of whom I stay in contact with to this day. My interest in this camp was piqued after listening to my grandparents' stories about Macau. This experience instilled a sense of pride in my heritage, and I'm grateful that my family has kept their Macanese traditions alive throughout my childhood and have been actively involved in making lasting contributions

to preserve the culture of the Macanese community for the last 40 years.

Growing up in Macau, my grandfather, Roberto João De Graça, has had the most significant involvement of anyone in my family. Ever since moving to the United States, he has held leadership positions in Macanese cultural organizations and dedicated countless hours to support the community. For instance, he was involved in approving the purchase of the Macau Cultural Center in Fremont and contributed in writing the bylaws. He even donated \$10,000 for the windows of the building. In terms of his leadership, he has been President of UMA for its Concord and East Bay chapters, and served as director and VP of the overall organization. As a matter of fact, he is such a highly respected member of the community that he represented the Macanese when the President of Portugal visited the Bay Area. Additionally, my grandfather and grandmother (Margaret De Graça) were interviewed, at the request of Lusitano, by a college professor at UC Berkeley about Macanese culture.

Along with my grandfather, my family as a whole has been deeply involved in preserving our heritage. My older sister, Emma, is a director on the board of Lusitano, involved in the Youth Program at the Cabrillo Civic Club, a member of UMA, loves learning about Macanese history, and plans to attend the Youth Encontro to Macau. My younger sister, Morgan, loves to make Macanese food, especially



Minchi (my favorite!), and continues to try out new recipes in the Lusitano bulletin, such as Pastéis de Nata. Additionally, all of us have attended the annual Lusitano Christmas party, picnic, and Día de Portugal Festival for many years, and many of my relatives have attended the language courses at the Macau Cultural Center.

Personally, besides Portugal winning the 2016 European Championships (I'm a HUGE Ronaldo fan... nicknamed Conaldo!) one of my favorite moments in celebrating my Portuguese heritage was carrying the Lusitano banner during the 2019 Día de Portugal parade.



Additionally, I'm a confirmed Catholic who serves as an usher, greeter, and Youth Group volunteer at St. Mary Catholic Church in Walnut Creek, so I really appreciate that many of the Macanese teens I meet are Catholic. My family and I are proud to be Macanese, now more than ever, and I plan to pass on the traditions of the Macanese people to my kids and grandkids, and further my knowledge of Portuguese culture at the University of Notre Dame.

# *Celebrating* **ARNIE BARROS at 100!**

Born in Shanghai on July 26, 1922, Arnie was quite the accomplished equestrian, soccer and softball player, dancer and motorcyclist. Arnie and his family relocated to Hong Kong after WWII, then again to San Francisco in the late 1950s, where he raised his family and still currently resides. Arnie enjoyed a long and prosperous career with Otis Elevator until his retirement.

Arnie was also a tournament level 10-pin bowler who won many trophies before he moved onto lawn bowling in 1990, joining the San Francisco Lawn Bowling Club (SFLBC), and subsequently winning many championships. Arnie still bowls today and after 32 years, is the oldest active bowler in the Club’s 121 year history. He served as their President and long time Chair and social coordinator over the years.

On his 100th birthday, the SFLBC network of friends and family celebrated his birthday by hosting a BBQ lunch in his honor with lawn bowling throughout the day. Arnie was presented with a Proclamation from the City & County of San Francisco declaring July 26, 2022 as Arnald “Arnie” Barros Day by his district supervisor Carmen Chu. A Proclamation from SFLBC was also presented to Arnie by its President.

Aside from being active with SFLBC, Arnie is involved with the Macanese community. He served as the President of UMA for many years, and is a long time member of Lusitano. He helped organized and taught beginners to bowl at our Lusitano SFLBC events.

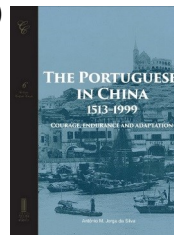

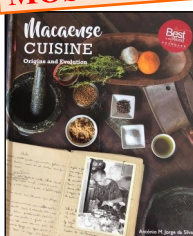

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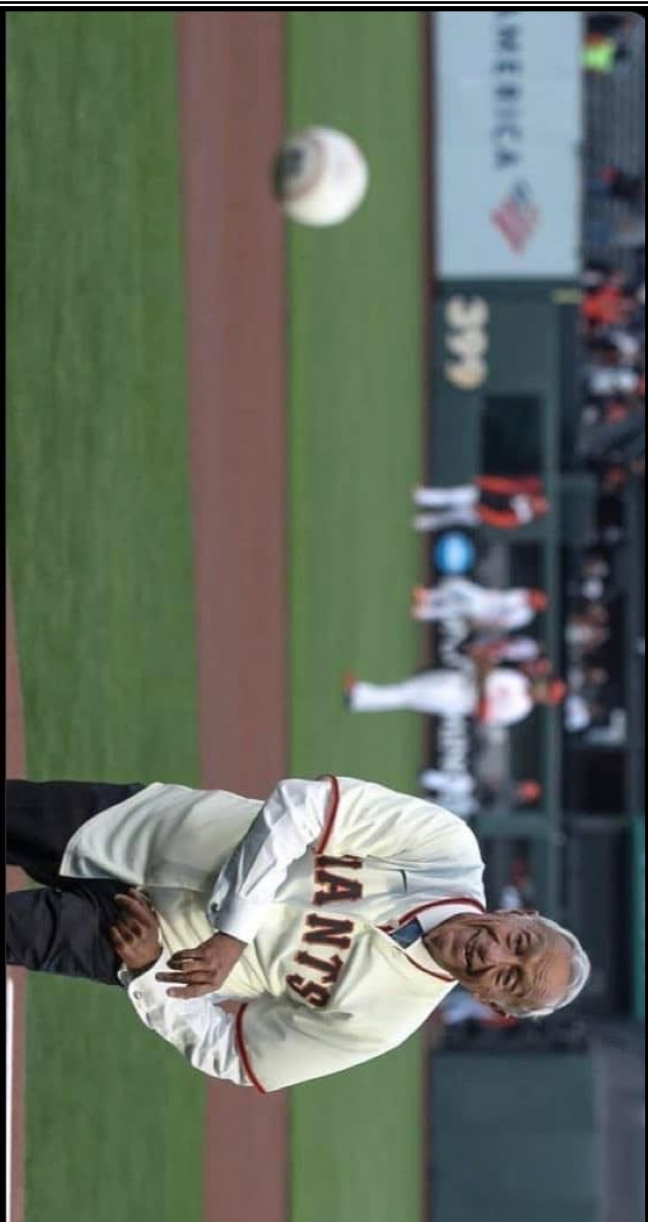
