A new Macanese Cookbook has just been published in Macau!



RECIPES

Served at the Clambake by Dorothy Oliveira

Macau African Chicken

Ingredients:

3 to 3½ lbs of chicken pieces

1 tsp chili powder

1 tsp garlic, minced

2 Tbsp shallot, minced

1 tsp paprika

2 tsp five-spice powder

3 tsp of salt

A few turns of freshly ground black pepper



Sauce:

Vegetable oil

1 cup shallot, minced

½ cup garlic, minced

½ cup paprika

1/4 cup sugar

2 Tbsp peanut butter

1 cup chicken stock

1 cup coconut milk

2 bay leaves

Directions:

Chicken. Marinade chicken overnight with all the ingredients. Bake at 350 degrees for one hour or when chicken is done.

Sauce. Fry the minced shallots in a little oil then add the minced garlic and fry a little until fragrant. Add paprika, sugar. chicken stock and bay leaves and simmer a bit. Add coconut milk and peanut butter and simmer for about 15 minutes.

Serve the sauce on top of the chicken or on the side.

Serradura

Ingredients:

2 cups heavy cream 1/2 can condense milk About 30 Marie biscuits 1/2 tsp vanilla extract



Directions:

- In a food processor, pulse Marie biscuits until it is like fine sand and set aside.
- Whip cream until pretty thick, about a minute. Add vanilla extract
 and whip a bit more. Add condense milk and whip until stiff peaks.
 If you want it sweeter you can add more condense milk. Watch and
 make sure you do not over whip as you will then get sweet butter.
- In your choice of container, pipe in cream and smooth out the top. Tap on counter to try to get any bubbles that might have form. Sprinkle some crumbs over cream but not too much as you want the crumbs to absorb some of the cream. Repeat a couple of times and end with cream on top. You can add more crumbs for the topping and then refrigerate. If using sweet egg topping, refrigerate before adding the egg topping

For the sweet egg topping.

Ingredients:

6 egg yolks 1 teaspoon milk 2 tablespoons water 1/4 cup sugar

Directions:

In a saucepan, pour in water and sugar. On medium heat, stir until thread like syrup. Do not boil or allow it to become golden color. In a bowl, whisk egg yolks and milk. Gradually while still whisking, add your syrup slowly incorporating into the yolks. Drizzle on top of cream and refrigerate.

Serve at room temperature and enjoy

On June 12th, the Mission Chamber Orchestra of San Jose sponsored by the Portuguese Government also presented a live concert performance of chamber music by Portuguese composers at Five Wounds Portuguese National Church.

Dia de Portugal is one of the most celebrated day by Portuguese throughout the world as it commemorates the



death on June 10, 1580 of Luís de Camões, a poet and national literary icon. Although officially observed only in Portugal, as a national holiday, Portuguese resident nationals and Portuguese expatriates throughout the world celebrate Day of Portugal as a time to display their national pride and cultural heritage. Dia de São João - June 24th

This year marks the 400 years celebration of Macau's victory and its heroes who repelled the Dutch invaders (see commemorative poster on our back cover designed by Victor Marreiros).




It was on June 24, 1622 that 200 outnumbered Macau residents managed to repel an invasion of a strong army of about 1,200 Dutch soldiers, supported by 14 ships. Asides being the day of St John the Baptist "Dia de São João", this date has also been declared as Macau City Day — a very important date for all Macanese and celebrated each year ever since 1622.
