RECIPE

"BOLOS DE ARROZ" (Portuguese Rice Muffins)

by Dorothy Oliveira

Makes 12

Ingredients:

1 cup rice flour
1 cup all purpose flour
100 ml milk
1 cup sugar
2 eggs & 2 egg yolks room temperature
Zest of 1/2 a lemon
113 g butter room temperature
2 tsp baking powder
Pinch of salt



Directions:

- Pre heat oven to 350F.
- Line your muffin pan with parchment paper or the larger cupcake liners. If using parchment paper cut into 2" high strips and around 3" long. Use two pieces for each muffin so that the paper overlaps each other in the muffin pan.
- Cream butter & sugar until light and fluffy.
- Add egg yolks and eggs, one at the time and mix well.
- In a bowl mix all dry ingredients together. Add to batter a little at the time and mix slowly. Add milk and mix well.



- Scoop into each muffin about 3/4 full.
- Bake at 350 for 20 minutes. Take out and sprinkle sugar on each and bake for another 10 minutes.
- These are best eaten when warm with a cup of espresso.



Portuguese Immigrant Week March 4 - 11, 2023

California is home to the largest population of Portuguese Americans across the nation. Since the inception of Portuguese Immigrant Week (2nd week in March) in 1967 by then Governor of California Ronald Reagan, the Portuguese American community has proudly attended a wreath ceremony annually to recognize and celebrate all the courageous Portuguese immigrants at Root Park in San Leandro. This year the 56th Annual Portuguese Immigrant Week was





held on March 4th, the start of a week long celebration by various organizations. Despite the rain, there was a great turnout followed by a wonderful lunch celebration at the Portuguese Band of San Leandro Hall. Thank you to the Portuguese Fraternal Society of Portugal (PFSA), Luso -American Financial and the Consulate General of Portugal for hosting this event.

The symbolic statue at Root Park created by Azorean sculptor Numidico Bessone was offered to the City of San Leandro in 1964 by União Portuguesa do Estado da California, now part of PFSA. This statue symbolizes a person carrying a heavy burden, the difficulties and struggles of the emigrant; yet it also shows a man in front of a ship's prow symbolizing the strength, courage and sense of adventure of the Portuguese emigrant.
